The Killbuck Valley Railroad - Part 1 of 3

Deep in the heart of central Ohio lies the Killbuck Valley. This imposing geographical feature runs from Lodi in the north to Millersburg in the south, with the Killbuck

Creek flowing through its entirety. The valley has long been an agricultural stronghold, despite the creek's propensity to flooding, along with small-scale coal mining and logging. Although sparsely populated, the valley is highly productive and economically successful.

At one time, there was a railroad in the valley and it created a vital link to the outside world for the valley's inhabitants. The B&O had a branchline that ran from Lodi to Millersburg, crossing the Erie and Wheeling and

Lake Erie near Burbank and the Pennsylvania Railroad at Wooster and Millersburg.

In my "what if," proto-freelanced world, the Killbuck Valley Railroad was a narrow gauge predecessor to the B&O's standard gauge line. This bare bones, cobbled



together shortline operated on a shoestring budget and was always at the mercy of the creek's flooding. Although the fictitious line interchanged with the aforementioned

> standard gauge lines, it was largely independent and self-supporting.

The following pictorial is a trip down the Killbuck Valley in the fall of 1920 and captures the essence of what narrow gauge railroading was like in rural Ohio in the early 1900's. The Killbuck Valley Line takes its inspiration from the Ohio River & Western and the Conotton Valley Railroad, along with some artistic license.

The actual modeled features are built on wall shelves that are roughly 8"x24" and 3" thick.

The shelves could be secured to the wall with screws or simply displayed on a flat table. The advantage of these small shelves is that you can complete a distinct section before moving on to the next one. You can focus on the track work and scenery for each section without having to look beyond that immediate project. The satisfaction of connecting the finished sections is very motivating and rewarding.

Through the next few months, I will explain some of the techniques used in building these shelf dioramas and how to create a purpose and story behind your modeling. Although the modular sections are non-operational, they provide excellent photographic opportunities and a canvas for practicing modeling techniques. Each section can be

easily stored in a plastic container and taken to various outside locations for photographing.

An objective of this small-scale modeling is to encourage modelers to complete a project on a very high standard and look at model railroading as an artistic endeavor. The shelves, available at Hobby Lobby, come unstained and can be decorated to your liking. In theory, they can be wall-mounted as scenicked display shelves or 3-D art in your basement or office. The idea is that model railroading can be an exercise in creativity, without requiring a lot of space or ongoing commitment to a singular project, i.e. layout. The shelves would be particularly useful in N scale, and are similar to T-TRAK modules. The potential localities or subjects that could be modeled are limitless and may provide a good diversion from your main layout. Personally, I was interested in pursuing a small project dedicated to a freelanced Ohio narrow gauge railroad, and this format fit the bill. Next month, we will look at the preparation of the shelves and the initial scenery base.

Now Indy Junction 2022 is scheduled for May 18 - 22 in Indianapolis and the clock is ticking.

The original idea for several regions to get together and put on a convention was because the NMRA National Convention was to be held in Birmingham, England in 2022 and it was reasoned that many would opt to attend a convention in the middle of the USA. What's more, instead of a week abroad, it would be 4 full days in Circle City (Indianapolis) at The Crossroads of America. As we all know now, Birmingham didn't work out but Indy Junction is going to take place and we'll be packing our bags to attend in just a few months from now.

The Midwest Region, North Central Region, and the Mid Central Region have joined together to make it happen. And Indy Junction will be a suburban convention not a downtown convention. The Indianapolis Marriott East is easily accessible from I-465/I-70 with reasonable room

rates and FREE parking. And the convention will take place in the spring - the most beautiful time of the year out on the edge of the prairie.

Layout tours will be during the day and they're ALL self-driving so you can spend as much time as YOU want at each stop. We are planning a two-day train show for Saturday and Sunday. But it won't be a flea market/buy/trade/sell event. You will not see the big name manufacturers who only bring displays to the show. Instead, we're looking at having smaller but well-known manufacturers who will sell direct to you as an attendee.

And of course there will be all the rest of the usual things - contests, non-rail, prototype tours, and other activities.


