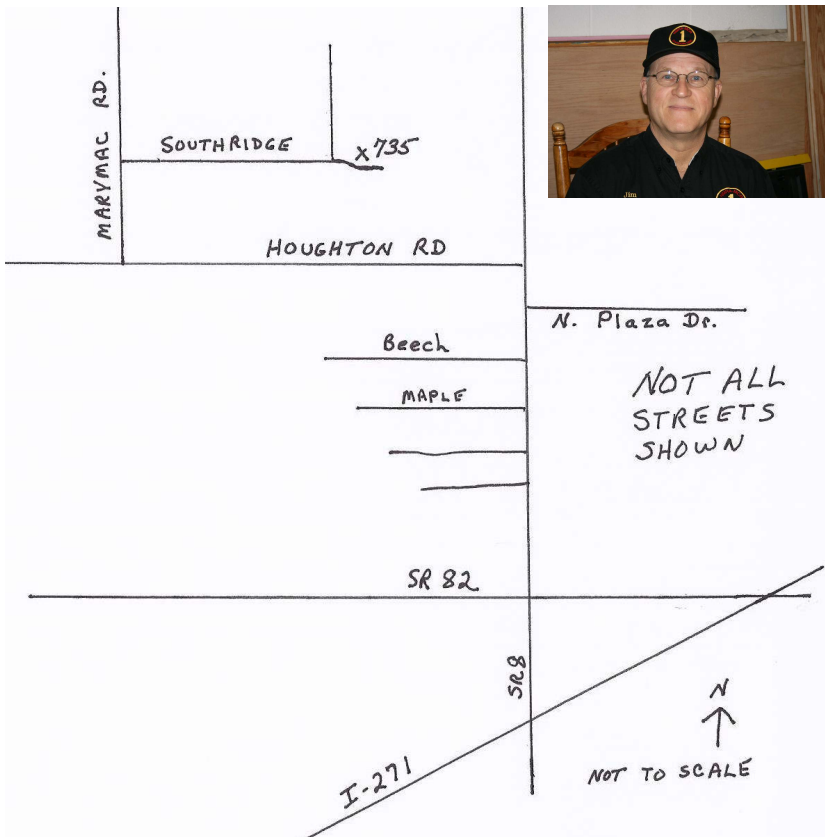

## DIVISION 1 MEETING MINUTES

June 11, 2011

Host: Randy Dettmer, Hudson



The meeting was called to order at 2:05 pm by Superintendent Randy Dettmer. Twenty-four people were in attendance. Randy thanked everyone for coming. He said we could rail fan the Norfolk Southern behind his house after the meeting but we should watch out for poison ivy. The tracks were the former Pennsy Chicago mainline and his house is at milepost 99.

1. A motion was made to accept the minutes of the May meeting as published in the Peddler Freight. The motion was seconded and passed.
2. The Treasurer's report was given by Bob Ashley, Jr. A motion was made to accept the report pending audit. The motion was seconded and passed.
3. The membership report was made by Larry Brown. The division's membership still stands at 102. We lost two members but gained two to replace them. The two new members are Rick Rowlands from Youngstown and C. David Post from Copley. Two renewals were for Tom Babcox and Richard Melvin. Larry will be sending out information cards to all members in the division to attempt to get members to participate in the roster. 50% of our members are currently on the roster but only 15% have requested copies of it.
4. Committee reports:
  - a. O, HO, N, and Z Scales - no reports.
  - b. Achievement Program (David Hazlett, Chuck Boyer and Don Deakins are on the committee): David is still waiting to hear back on Glen Yoder's Golden Spike Award. The paperwork has been submitted. 2010-11 Contest Awards: (1) Kit Bashed – Chuck Boyer, (2) Scratch Built – Larry Brown, (3) Kit Built – Bill Hewitt. Each was given a certificate and a division patch.
  - c. Clinics – Jim Peters: Is still looking for participants. A sign-up sheet was passed around. Randy Dettmer will put on a clinic about hopper cars after the meeting.
  - d. Modules – Bob Ashley, Sr.: The module group would like to purchase a banner similar to Division-4's so that people are aware that our division is participating along with the other divisions. New turnouts should be in at The Whistle Stop in several weeks. Bob stated that he needed some 3/4" plywood and Larry Brown said that he will donate it.
5. Old Business
  - a. Hosts are still needed for March, April, May, and June of 2012. The following people volunteered: Jim Williams for March, David Hazlett for April, Jim DiPaola for May, and Bill Hewitt for June.
  - b. Flea Market – Randy will mail postcards to all members in September soliciting their attendance. The cost will be roughly \$75.
  - c. It was suggested that we also conduct some PR with clubs such as the ones in Youngstown and Sebring and the CVT at The Whistle Stop Hobby Shop. Randy will pursue this.
6. New Business
  - a. David Hazlett has volunteered to be the new editor of the Peddler Freight, replacing Bill Smith who retired. David stated that last year 30 people contributed \$15 each to support the monthly mailings. Unless a member has requested an e-mail copy, a Peddler Freight is mailed to all division members. David put out cards for people to fill-out to indicate how they would like to receive their copy and if they would like to make a \$15 contribution towards the mailing expenses. If a member does make a donation they can have a non-commercial ad for no charge. A pike ad costs \$5 for the year. It was suggested that we also send copies of the newsletter each month to the clubs located within the division (see C above).
  - b. Randy initiated a discussion about the contest awards for next year, 2011-12, and suggested that perhaps we make them a monetary amount. Jim Williams made a motion that we give each of next year's 4 category winners a \$50 Visa gift card. The motion was seconded by Don Bonk but failed on vote. It was felt by some that people participated not for the award but because they liked to model and the presentation of a certificate was enough recognition.
  - c. Bill Hewitt stated again, as he did at the last meeting, that he thought we should get to know each other better and that at each meeting one or two people should get up and tell the group about themselves: who they are, what they have done, and what they are doing in model railroading. Randy suggested that we have a "member focus" spot on the agenda for each meeting and we could also include this information in the newsletter. Bill also apologized for the error on the map to his house for last month's meeting.

A motion was made and seconded to adjourn. The motion was passed. The meeting was adjourned at 3:12 p.m.

Here are two good links in Z. The first gives a good view of the very large Z Scale Modular Layout at the 2011 Sacramento NMRA/NTS convention. The layout won first and third place at the show. The video also shows the Golden-Blackhawk layout which was seen at the Detroit Convention. The yard on the modules has over 108 tournouts and holds over 640 pieces of rolling stock. The yard is built of Rokuhan track and turnouts. Rokuhan is a new manufacturer in Z and is coming on at warp speed.

N-Scalers I recommend that you get a copy of the July/ August N-Trak Newsletter. July/August is a big one running 24 pages including three pages devoted to new products.

The “narrow gauge page” covers the 2 Shay locomotives operated by the Yosemite Mountain Sugar Pine RR and how to convert the Republic Locomotive Works shay kit into either engine #10 or #15. The conversion information would be of interest to modelers of all scales. Article was of special interest because before the NMRA convention in Sacramento, CA; Carol and I had the pleasure of participating in the Sugar Pine’s Moonlight tour.

There is also a great evaluation of the Fox Valley Model’s 1935 Hiawatha set. It is a beautiful model as described. At the Mid-Central Regional Convention I found one at the right price . If you can, get one yourself. There is one problem with the DCC ready engine noted in the article. When a decoder was installed, engine speed suffered, especially with sound decoders. Fox Valley Models is working to resolve this problem.

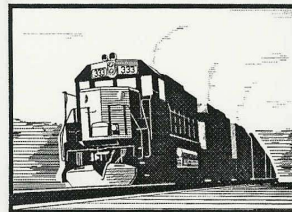

## MODULE REPORT

Welcome back to the regular season for model railroading. During the summer, we scheduled four module displays. The module display setups will be as follows:

November 6, 2011, Division 1 Flea Market, Akron Yacht Club, setup 11-5-2011;  
November 13, 2011, Buckeye Event Center, Train Show, Dalton Ohio, setup 11-12-2011;  
March 25, 2012, Buckeye Event Center, Train Show, Dalton Ohio, setup 3-24-2011; and,  
November 11, 2012, Buckeye Event Center, Train Show, Dalton Ohio, setup 11-10-2012.

The Flea Market setup will be small and use the two end modules and one or two regular modules, due to the limited space. The floor space at the 11-13-2011, Buckeye Event Center, is 24' x 48' using an "L" shape layout. We will have room for about six regular modules and the Division 1 modules. The 3-25-2012 event is going to be larger and we may have Division 4 joining us with this layout.

By the time you read this, I hope to have resumed laying the rest of the track on the division modules. We now have everything in stock to finish the track and wiring, except the two curved crossings. I am also hoping that we have started the scenery.

Scott Benson, Division 4 Module Coordinator, has requested that Division 1 join them to setup modules at the next NMRA National Train Show in Grand Rapids, MI. This could involve a bus trip, with the bus pulling a trailer for the modules, which is driven by David James from Div. 4. This trip will last at least three days and involve hotel rooms, meals, bus fare and other related cost to each person. There will be more on this at the next meeting.

I have started building eight modules, at my home, and have some additional supplies for three more. If you wish to purchase a module, please advise me. Call me if you wish to help any day or evening during the week.

Bob and I will be working on the division modules on random evenings and weekends as our schedules permit. I will be notifying the membership when we can work. If you can help, let us know when you can be available. We will be looking for people to help apply scenery to the division modules and build kits for buildings.

I have had several requests for kits or finished standard modules. I have received the electrical supplies. You must pay for your module prior to taking it with you. The price is \$67.00 each for the materials and \$33.00 each for the wiring kit. This is subject to change based on current cost. Also, it does not include the mandatory NCE UTP Fascia Panel Socket for plugging in your throttle which is available for \$17.00 from me or at The Whistle Stop. This works with Digitrax or NCE. A module can be built without a UTP.

We are going to reverse the installed UTP's that are upside down and make all UTP's require that the tab is up on the plugs. I will be trying to make the socket foolproof like other sockets in the industry by adding a strip to the face of the socket.

I am planning to make a modified Division logo with the "Module Group" added and a shirt to go with it. There will be more on this at the meeting. We also need a sign for display above the modules. Please contact me if you can help with the sign.

# NEW RULES FOR THE DIVISION 1 CONTEST

Starting in September 2011, the Contest Committee has added a new category and an Information Sheet to the contest.

This new Information Sheet was presented to the members attending the May meeting. The only question asked was concerning RTR models. Since the newer RTR models are very detailed (in many cases) it was asked if there would be a category for those. There will not be a category for the RTR models. RTR models could be used as a basis for entries in the Kit-Bashed category.

While kits are not as available as they once were, we are keeping the Kit-Built category which is now called Standard Kit. We have kept the Scratch-Built and Kit-Bashed categories and have added another category called Craftsman Kit.

The Information Sheet will need to be filled out and submitted with each model entered. This will allow the model builder to indicate what he has done to the model. The Information Sheet is available on the website.

The Contest will still be a popular vote contest.

In each category 1<sup>st</sup> Place = 3 pts., 2<sup>nd</sup> Place = 2 pts. and 3<sup>rd</sup> Place = 1 pt. This is used if three (3) or more models are competing in the category. If only two (2) models are in a category, 1st = 2pts. and 2<sup>nd</sup> = 1 pt. If only 1 model is in the category, then it receives 1 pt.

## DEFINITION of SCRATCH BUILT

To be considered scratch built, a model must have been constructed by the applicant without the use of any commercial parts except :

motor	trucks	bell	valve gear	car brake fittings
gears, drivers and wheels			basic wood, metal and plastic shapes.	
couplers, light bulbs/LED's			marker and classification lights	

A model is considered SCRATCH BUILT if at least 90% of the model's pieces/parts (other than those specifically exempted in the list above) are fabricated by the modeler. Any of the exempted parts may also be scratch built.

## DEFINITION of CRAFTSMAN KIT

A CRAFTSMAN KIT is one in which the skill required to build it is considerably more than the standard box kit (like the old Athern or MDC kits). Tichy car kits and similar ones are considered CRAFTSMAN KITS.
