This month we will meet at the Whistle Stop in Cuyahoga Falls, OH and be able to see the Cuyahoga Valley Terminal club layout. See you then!




#### **Convention 2014 Layout Committee Report**





#### **Clinic Report**

When listening to our *Peddler Freight* editor make his appeal for more members to voluntarily receive the newsletter electronically, I asked myself why some might be so reluctant. Besides the obvious and understandable reason it is simply one's preference, it occurred to me there is also the member who only reads the newsletter and does not come out to the meetings. This member may

say: Why bother going when I can read about everything in the newsletter. Let me see if I can sway you then to rethink your decision.

Last month our October meeting took place in Wooster, Ohio. What a fantastic venue! Our host Karl Emler (pictured at the right and below) was not only instrumental in making arrangements, but also started off a three-person clinic! With inexpensive spray paint, flock and hair spray, he transformed the weed Sedum into beautiful trees. Additionally, he took the prickly Musk Thistle and created trimmed trees for the front yard or around trailers.







Luana Peters then suggested we buy flowers for our significant others, but make sure they include Baby's Breath. When discarding the flowers, the Baby's Breath can be separated and grouped around floral wire, wrapped with floral tape, sprayed with brown and green, and finally sprinkled with flock while the paint is still wet. (Luana is pictured at the right getting ready to present a flower and Baby's Breath to a lucky person.)





My trains may not be running at the moment, but I love making trees, too. I introduced a technique presented originally by Randall Fields in Athens, Ohio. He collects a large amount of tree armatures by cutting away the very fine roots of large, overturned trees, such as when clearing for a new roadway or development. I collect these in a large plastic bucket because the next stage requires rinsing the dirt away. When dry, trim the roots into a nice looking tree minus leaves. I put 10 or 12 of these into a Styrofoam base to make it easy to spray paint gray, my choice for tree trunks. Next, I add polyfiber, a product at a craft store, by pulling and the

fiber thin. I then spray black from underneath the best I can and from the top green. Next, I sprinkle green flock and finish with a lighter flock to imitate the light from above. Finally, and this is true for all three techniques, poke a whole in your layout, add white glue and plant a new tree. Both Karl and I suggest grouping the trees for a better effect. I generally group trees in threes.

If last month's clinic alone is not enough to bring you out, then maybe the fact that we will have a guest clinician from Division 4 speaking about the Golden Spike Award and Scenery Certificate might help. Bruce Brintnall is not only an MMR, he also holds the envious position as one of the very few who have earned all 12 certificates. The clinic is only a small part of our monthly meetings. C'mon out and join in on the fun!

## CONTEST RULE CHANGE AT THE OCTOBER 2013 MEETING

If only two (2) models are in a category,1st = 3pts. and 2<sup>nd</sup> = 2 pts. If only 1 model is in the category, then it receives 2 pts. In addition, any model entered into the contest and not winning will be awarded 1 pt.

#### **N SCALE NEWS**

Jim Fitzgerald, editor of the NTRAK Newsletter for the past 40 years, surrounded by friends, passed away peacefully at his home in Paso Robles, Ca. Jim worked with Ben Davis, Tom Knapp and others founders of the Belmont Shores train club to develop the NTRAK concept and the first NTRAK layout at NMRA 1974 Convention.

I first met Jim at the "Rail Alive 75" NMRA convention in Dayton where Jim's scratch built, prize winning "Cotton Brute" diesel demonstrated his skills as a designer and builder of special instruments for NASA that helped to break the sound barrier along with solving other challenges. Over the years I would find Jim along with his wife at NMRA and N-Scale conventions offering tech support and overall guidance to any model railroader in need. Therefore, Jim developed many friendships within the model railroader community.

At 90 years old Jim was WW-II veteran, part of the rapidly disappearing greatest generation of gentlemen. A memorial with Military Honors will be held at the Chapel of the Roses, in Atascadero, CA Saturday, November 23, 2013 at 11:00 AM. In lieu of flowers, donations in his honor can be made to the Salvation Army.

#### **MODULE GROUP**

Thanks to Jim Williams for the beautiful work in adding scenery to the left end modules. This report is brief so some of his images can be seen, below. Jim asks that we add more people and vehicles to "round-out" the scene and bring it to life. Please help with donations. No report will be made to the government concerning "trafficking of people".

We have committed to show the modules at the Greater Wayne County Train & Toy Show on Sunday, November 10, 2013. The setup will be at 5:00 PM to 9:00 PM, Saturday, the day before the show. The time will also be announced by email, also. This show will include the NTRAK and HO modules. Due to Don Bonk having to attend a wedding in Columbus, Saturday, we are going to be short handed. We need extra help. Please come help us because we must set up both NTRAK and HO modules.

When we setup at Dalton, the NTRAK modules will be placed in front of the HO modules. We will be operating using the Digitrax DCC systems with the ability to use the Duplex radio version. We must not use the Digitrax UR-91 simplex receiver due to the cell phone boosters in use in the building. The UR-92 Duplex receiver is OK to use with the DT402D throttles and those of us with the DT400R and UT4R simplex throttles will need to tether to the panels. Hopefully, we will not have any compatibility problems. It will be necessary to set each layout to a different DCC number. It is explained in the instructions for the duplex throttles.

We will setup and operate the HO modules in January at the regular division meeting, also. The setup will be announced later and this will be a one day event. The March 23, 2014 showing of the modules, at Dalton, conflicts with the regular Sunday meeting. Unless we change the meeting date, we either miss the meeting or cancel the show and loose \$100.00. Maybe we could have enough crew at the show to operate the layouts and have members come to the show after the meeting to help tear down.


