At our February 2020 Event at the Kent Free Library a Division 1 member brought in an Atlas HO Articulated Auto Carrier he was having an issue with. (see page 3) The plastic brake line under the car was deformed and the member wanted suggestions on how to straighten the thin plastic line. A good discussion ensued with suggestions offered and techniques discussed on what to do with

the uncooperative part. It will be interesting to see what our member decided to do. This discussion also touched on the difficulty in gluing different materials to each other.

In my quest for the optimum glues I came across Deluxe Materials who makes many different types of glues for different applications. The owner is a chemical engineer who just happens to be a model railroader. I watched a video available on YouTube titled "New Products for North American Modelers" of an interview conducted by Model Railroad Hobbyist Magazine with the owner of Deluxe Materials. It's a super informative video about all the fantastic products

Deluxe Materials makes for the model railroader. They have published an excellent chart for matching types of glues to materials to be glued. It's a free download from their website (click chart at left) and is on the Division 1 website. Please check it out as

it's a great reference. Deluxe Materials are sold by Walthers and can be ordered from your hobby shop or online.

The discussion at our February Event was very interesting so again I challenge members who come to the March Event to bring a question, model or protype railroad related, that they would like answered.

A motion was made and seconded to adjourn the meeting. The motion passed. The business meeting adjourned at 3:30 pm.



## My first T-TRAK Module

Being an N scale modeler it seems appropriate that I build at least one T-TRAK module. I have seen the layouts displayed at the NMRA National Train Shows, Trainfest in Wisconsin and the Ohio N-Scale Weekend. When a large T-TRAK layout was on display and running trains at The Bullet MCR Regional Convention sponsored by Div. 1 last May, I knew it was time to commit.

Already having a travelling 3' x 6' n scale layout and a 2' x 4' NTRAK module, why not one more? With CMR Products selling their laser cut module kits at the convention, I decided to buy my first T-TRAK module kit.

According to the website www.t-trak.
org, the history of T-TRAK can be traced to Japan and Lee Monaco-Fitzgerald, wife of Jim Fitzgerald of NTRAK fame. Jim was invited to speak at the convention of the Japan Association of

Model Railroaders (JAM) held in August of 2000. Monaco-Fitzgerald attended the convention with Jim and observed modules from the Hino N Club. They were about 4" high and displayed on banquet tables. In September of 2001 the NTRAK Newsletter introduced the concept of T-TRAK to its readers.

Division 1 plans to roll out its first layout of T-TRAK modules at the May 17 event hosted by Kurt and Karen


Figure 3: After applying wood glue to the tabs, each piece easily slid into place.

Sanders. Having committed to bringing a module to the May Event, it was past time to get started.

I purchased a Tab Tec module manufactured by CMR Products. **(see figure 1)** Their straight modules come in singles, doubles, triples and quads. The single is the basic unit of T-TRAK, measuring 308mm or 12 1/8" wide. The depth can vary from 125 – 365 mm (5" – 14 3/8"). I decided on a double straight module, **(see figure 2)** figuring it would allow for more scenery while still having the advantage of compactness. My double is 618 mm (24 5/16") by 14" deep.

CMR has a nice YouTube video explaining module assembly in detail. The module itself contains the top and four sides that are glued (see figure 3) together and taped until dry. All the parts easily came together with the tabs making errors next to impossible. After taping all the corners and edges I decided to use some clamps to really snug it all the together. (see figure 4) Next month's installment will cover the leveling hardware, track installation and wiring, and hopefully the beginning of scenery.







