This is United States; where there's a will there is way, and you can bet I'll be dropping in to chat with them at the NMRA National Convention at Novi, Michigan in July.

April 30 marked 125th anniversary of Casey Jones' legendary ride into eternity.

The once popular song, Casey Jones was written by a black roundhouse worker for which he never received a dime! The locomotive was jinxed-after Jones died in the wreck it was:

- rebuilt
- reumbered three times
- involved in a number of accidents resulting in the deaths of three more engineers
- finally scrapped-good riddance

The word caboose was originally a nautical term defined as "a house on deck where cooking is done..." as the story goes that's why they are known as "Crummies."

The 1969 "Centennial Celebration" of the completion of the transcontinental railroad.

A big to do list was planned. Problem was in 1969 promontory point Utah no longer had real service. Solution:

- a two mile long section of track that went nowhere connected to nothing was built
- two replica locomotives were found and trucked to the site where they were set in place by cranes
- It gets better 81 rail fans paid \$995 to ride a train from New York to witness the celebration they were bussed to the location.

Speaking of Centennial Celebrations:

- After looking over official photographs of the original meeting, then governor Leland Stanford was "highly disturbed" at the number of whiskey bottles visible. Governor Stanford instructed the artist doing the official mural of the meeting to "leave out the bottles."

First rail of the B&O was laid on July 4, 1828 by Charles Carroll, the last living signer of the Declaration of Independence.

Focus of motion included horses on a treadmill and sails.


