DIVISION 1, MCR, NMRA REPORT TO THE REGIONAL BOD May 14, 2010

Division 1 elections are slated for May 23, 2010. I have reached the Division's term limits and Division 1 will have a new Superintendent and Assistant Superintendent starting in June of 2010.

Five years ago Division 1 was considered the worst Division in the Region. I contend that this opinion is no longer valid.

During the last five years, the attendance at Division meetings has increased from 6 to more than 20; we now have clinics and presentations; we have a modeling contest (popular vote, not AP) which allows members to display their work; we have a Division 1 railroad flea market; we have a fledgling module group; we have a newsletter that is sent to all members, not just subscribers; we have had an increase in the number of members hosting; we now have clothing and patches identifying Division 1; we have additional members writing articles for the <u>Peddler Freight</u>; we have a functional website; we are growing even through we are not increasing in membership; since June 2009 we are demonstrably 100% NMRA.

Division 1 has been rebuilding and will continue to advance the hobby of model railroading and the NMRA.

Know that whomever is elected, we all win. .



KADEE COUPLERS AND THE MAGNET by David H. Hazlett

A couple of weeks ago I was looking through the Model Railroader web page and came upon a discussion of Kadee uncoupling - magnets or other things. I do not consider myself an expert on ANY topic, but I have had forty years of experience with Kadee couplers and thought I'd share my experiences with you. Of course, all of my comments are based on HO experience.

I have spent considerable time, effort and expense to place uncoupling magnets on my layout. I want operators to use them - WHY? With the quality of detail on cars and locomotives, I really don't want probes or pencils used to uncouple my equipment. I find all kinds of tiny parts on my layout after op sessions. Many of these parts knocked off by probes and pencils! I also find broken handrails on the locos.

I hear comments that magnets always work when you don't want them to. Gee, isn't that terrible? The big guys (the real railroads) have problems with trains parting, why shouldn't we? I also hear comments that the magnets don't work. The magnets work ALL of the time - the couplers don't!

Do you remember the old horn-hook couplers? Talk about problems! They were why I changed to Kadee's. About 75-80% of my couplers work every time. They even work to delay uncouple. The other 20-25% of my couplers need adjusted. That is the big problem with Kadee uncouplers Now about those adjustments . . .

- Kadee #5's are the most useful. I like the larger size head as compared to the scale couplers. However, I have given up on the #5's. Instead, I am now using the #148 coupler. This is the "whisker" coupler with the #5 head. (The #158 has the scale head.) I find the #148 moves more easily in the pocket than the #5. I have yet to have weakened springs on the #148, but I have had poorly operating and bent springs on the #5.
- STAY WITH ONE BRAND OF COUPLER AND ONE HEAD SIZE! I find that if you mix coupler brands you get poor operation. If you like the #5 head, stay with it. Do not mix in the scale head couplers. If you like scale heads, stay with scale heads. Mixing different brands or head sizes makes uncoupling worse. When I buy a new car, I don't change the coupler, UNTIL it starts giving me problems. Then I change it. Now since I am not perfect, I do have two exceptions to different brands. First, I like to use McHenry's for my yard switchers. The coupler moves very easily from side to side, making it more useful in delayed moves. Second, I immediately remove Accurail couplers. That is, the two part couplers, in whatever brand they are found. I totally dislike them and replace them ON SIGHT! (If you like those, I have a bunch of them for you CHEAP!)
- 3 When you installed the coupler, did you use a gauge to adjust the height of the coupler head? Did you also adjust the coupler pin? Did you use the Kadee adjusting pliers or just a plain pair of pliers? I have found that the Kadee pliers work the best. I use the O-scale part of the plier to only slightly adjust the pin before installation. Usually, this works the best.
- 4 Did you lubricate the coupler pocket? Buy and use Kadee's Greas-em or a similar product.

Now that you have the adjustments to the couplers accomplished, you need only to "adjust" your operators. Operators must run slowly enough that they can stop near the middle of the magnet. By the way, GOOD LUCK on this part. After 15 years of operating sessions, I am not having much luck.
