





N-SCALE NEWS

There are those that believe that track cleaning must have been one of the labors of Hercules and the author is one of those true believers.

Some months back a limited report on a couple of track cleaning cars was provided in the PF. The September/October issue of N-Scale Magazine article gave an in depth evaluation of 20 track cleaners. The good news that while the article is directed at N-Scale almost every cleaner reviewed has an HO counterpart. A table outlines the 20 cleaner including \sim cost. Based upon article's coverage of the Aztec's 4 Cleaning cars the Bonk RR decided an "Eliminator" which is an upgrade of the "Track Star" should be purchased. The Bonk RR already has 4 "Track Star" cars. Reprints may be available from info@nscalemagazine.com.

Although the article discuss above is great, it is hard to keep up with the manufactures. Woodland Scenics markets a 4 pack of track duster that can be suspended from the wheelers of practically any car. Dusters are available in N and HO and were found a Rob's Trains in Alliance.

Those of you who attended the September Division 1 meeting know a set of 3 foot NTRAK corner modules are now available and hopefully the division can have reasonable size module layout for the March train show. The "Old Reliable" 4 foot module is relatively easy to build and handle. Bob Ashley Sr. has 4 foot module kits available that work for NTRAK as well as the HO group.

N-Scale modeler should consider attending the Region 3 convention in Dayton this spring. The N scale modeler in the Dayton area are very active, specially the module group. My registration number is 6. Hope to see you there.

- The meeting was called to order at 2:07 pm. Superintendent Randy Dettmer thanked Don and his wife for hosting the meeting. The weather was beautiful and they had a tent setup outside for our use. Twenty-one people were in attendance.
- A motion to accept the June Minutes as printed was made and seconded. The motion passed.
- III. Chuck Boyer gave the Treasurer's report. A motion to accept the report, subject to audit, was made and seconded. The motion passed.
- IV. Committee Reports:
 - a. Membership Larry Brown could not attend the meeting due to a conflict with work. A new member, Bruce Hukill, introduced himself. Bruce models in N-scale. A moment of silence was taken to acknowledge the passing of member Eli Rantanes. A report was given by Randy on David Hazlett's status: he is home from the hospital; his surgery went well; and he will probably undergo either radiation or chemotherapy in the near future. Frank Smith told of the HO refrigerator car they had brought for display. Jeffery Jensen had decorated in remembrance of Jim Bacher.
 - b. Clinics Jim Peters asked Don Bonk to give us an impromptu clinic on the N-scale modules he had setup in his garage. Don gave a nice talk on building modules for N-scale. Chuck Klein will put on a clinic on the RTA at the next meeting.
 - c. Flea Market The majority of the tables have been sold. Fliers are ready to be passed out at the Berea train show.
 - d. AP Randy presented Don Deakins his Golden Spike Award.
 - e. NMRA 2014 The Medical Mart construction is ahead of schedule and under budget. It should be ready by May of 2013. The convention now has a Facebook page. The problem with parking was brought up and Randy stated that it was being addressed.
 - Updates on different scales Kurt Sanders stated that Micro-Trains was issuing N-scale civil war trains. Bob Ashley, Sr. told of his frustration with Walthers. They are having problems with their supply chain in China and often, when they say something is in stock, it is not. Don Avila pointed out that Z-scale took the best of show and best module awards at the 2012 convention in Grand Rapids. Kurt Sanders reported that the photographs he entered in competition at the convention in Grand Rapids took 1st place and best of show.
 - g. Module Group Bob Ashley, Sr. reported that our participation at the Steel Mill Museum in Youngstown was cancelled at the last minute because Youngstown University wanted to use the space. He thanked the Sanders for their efforts in pursuing this venue. The next module setups are for the division flea market, the Dalton show and the division meeting in January at the Akron Yacht club.
 - h. Apparel Jim Williams pointed out that winter was on the way and we have 3 weights of sweatshirts for sale. Bob Ashley, Sr. said that the apparel selection was still not on the web-site.
 - i. Peddler Freight Randy Dettmer relayed to the group that none of the hobby shops have renewed their ads. He will keep canvassing them. The deadline for next month's addition will probably be October 7th.

a. Meetings for next year: March still needs a host.

VI. New Business:

- Jim Hoque and Jeffery Jansen have volunteered to help with the web-site. Randy asked for others that might want to help on a web-site committee but got no volunteers. Jeffery stated that the current web-site runs on old software that he was not familiar with and it needed to be recreated using more current software. Jim Hogue was not in attendance and it was hoped that he could update us at the next meeting.



GOLDEN SPIKE AWARD

Don Deakins is the latest Division 1 member to earn the NMRA's Golden Spike Award.

MODULE GROUP

Larry Madson, designer of the module standard and with Division 4, has announced that Hub Division, of the Boston Area, has found a way to incorporate an advanced DCC throttle. It is using Smart Phone WiFi technology to communicate with a laptop computer and JMRI Decoder Pro to operate the trains just like a regular DCC throttle. The advantage with this technology is the ability to operate wireless without interference from other DCC systems, since the radio frequency is different from regular DCC frequency. There is an app available for your Smart Phone from JMRI. This also requires an extra wire added to each module. He hopes to have this in place for the 2014 National Convention. We will still be able to operate using our regular throttles if they are tethered in a multi-layout hall. I do not expect this to happen overnight due to the testing and documentation required to set this up.

Three of the modules kits have been committed to John and Caleb Palagyi, Bob Ashley, Jr. and Bob Ashley, Sr. The price per module is \$67.00 each for the materials and \$33.00 each for the wiring kit and the mandatory NCE UTP Fascia Panel Socket for plugging in your throttle is available for \$17.00 from me or at The Whistle Stop. I am still looking for anyone interested in making an N gauge module to go with Kurt Sanders, Don Bonk and mine, per NTRAK standards or Z gauge module to go with mine, per Z Bend Track standards. Our module kits a suitable for this. Only the wiring is slightly different. We are hoping to have them ready for next November, at the Buckeye Event Center along with the HO modules.
