In the meantime, we have



The Ohio weekend is the place to find fantastic deals and unusual kits, models, and modules. Tales of a Shay: From Wreck to Reincarnation Part 2: Engine Mount, Universal Drive Shafts

As work on the new Shay continued a few things came to light. As a result this installment will be limited to the engine mount and the rebuilding of the universal drive shafts. The engine needs a spacer block to hold the engine at the right depth below the frame and, while not difficult a task, it was tedious. The spacer was cut from a small block of brass using hand saws. Then it was filed to the proper thickness and width (see Figure 3). The diagonal slot in the spacer was made with a jeweler's saw and then filed into its final shape. This slot accommodates a worm that extends down diagonally from the frame deck to engage the crank shaft gear at the bottom of the engine.



Figure 3: A spacer block was made to hold the engine the proper distance beneath the frame deck.

When making small parts, it's much easier to work at the end of a much larger piece. This practice employs the concept of "sacrificial material" that is cut away after the desired part is finished. Larger pieces are much easier to hold, clamp, and manipulate than a small part only a tiny fraction of an inch long (Figure 4). Here (Figures 5, 6, 7, 8 & 9) is the process I used for making the pivoting ends of two universal sleeve couplings.

Figure 4: A 0.032" diameter hole was drilled in the end of a piece of 3/32" square brass tube. The hole was piloted with a #80 drill, then a #76 drill, and finished with a #67 drill.



Figure 5: Using a rat tail file the square sides of the tube were rounded slightly on both sides of the hole.



Figure 6: The sides of the square tube were cut down to the base of the rounded notches using a jeweler's saw. The unwanted sides were bent outward and cut away. The resulting opening was then filed smooth.



Figure 7: The sides of the coupling were then spread apart and made parallel using square nosed pliers. The opening between the sides was made to match the width of the original parts.



Note: When drilling small holes mark their centers with a center punch and then pilot the hole with smaller bits. Don't drill the finished size holes first. If you do so, the center of the hole is more apt to migrate during drilling. A small drill press is also useful to ensure that the holes are drilled perpendicular to the piece. I used the Dremel Workstation drill press for this operation.

Figure 8: The universal end of the square shaft was made in a similar manner as the sleeve coupling. Here is a finished vertical hole of 0.020" in diameter with a horizontal hole of 0.032". Both holes extend through both walls of the square tube. The scribed line marking the finished width of the piece is visible in the photo.



Figure 9: Here is the finished piece after the square tube was cut to length and filed into its finished shape.



When installing these new parts into the coupling rings, first dimple the center of both ends of the shafts in the ring with a center punch in preparation for drilling out the old shafts. Don't tap the center punch with a hammer; just press it into the brass. The metal is soft enough that a depression sufficient to start #80 drill is created. Once the hole is piloted, use successively larger drills until the old shaft is drilled through and removed. This operation must be done by hand, as a power drill spinning a bit very quickly can cause massive damage just as quickly if there is a slip. I urge patience during this operation.

In Figure 10 two pieces of 0.032" solid brass rod were inserted through the coupling ring and into the end of the universal end of the square shaft. With a great deal of care, the new shaft pieces were soldered into place, cut to length, and then lightly filed to blend their ends into the coupling ring.


In Figure 11 a #76 drill was used to drill out the center of a piece of 0.060" styrene. Again, the end of the part was dimpled in its center with a center punch. This shape sleeves nicely into the 3/32" square brass tube used for the sleeve couplings.

Note: Only one of the two shafts involved runs all the way through the coupling ring. The second shaft is in two parts, thus leaving a gap in the center of the coupling ring allowing for the first shaft's location.


After sliding the square shaft most of the way down the 0.020" pin in the universal end of the assembly, a bit of CA adhesive was applied before the shaft was pushed into its final position.



MODULE GROUP

Thanks to David Hazlett, we had an op session for NMRA kids that are "Student Members". This was a wonderful time to let them learn about operating a large layout. Do your part, get your kids involved and enroll them as "Student Members". They will hopefully help our division membership and become leaders for the future.

We will show our modules, NTRAK and HO, at the Buckeye Event Center in Dalton on Sunday, 3/22/2015. We will set up on Saturday, 3/21/2015, starting at 5:00 PM. Please advise me if you will participate. Everyone is invited to operate and help with the layout. The last Dalton Show went off beautifully, and everyone did a good job.

The Summit County Richfield library has requested that we set up a model train show during the March spring break for the local universities and schools. They are promoting railroads and transportation during this event. We will set up Tuesday, March 31, 2015, and tear down Thursday, April 3, 2015. I will advise the location address and the starting time, in the next newsletter and by email. This show will come on the heels of the Dalton Show and may present problems with manning the modules during the week. There will be five HO straight modules, one corner and both loop ends. The NTRAK group is working on a small 4' x 6' layout to show, also. Let Don Bonk know if you can help. A pdf of the layout will be sent with the email. We need brochures and literature for distribution during this show.

Bob Ashley, Jr. and Jim Williams are working on a date to start adding Tortoise switch machines to the left end passenger modules. We also have some minor problems with the curved turnouts on the right end industrial modules. It may be necessary to hand lay a new turnout. We experienced derailing, at NTS 2014, of long wheelbase steam locomotives, due to the tighter curvature at the switch points. We will advise by email and will need your help to complete these projects.

Please advise me if you have made any changes to your wiring or track layout. We must not hook up any wiring to the layout until it has been tested for shorts. I have a meter that will test the CAT-5 wiring harness, and we can setup the power control box with your module(s) to test for shorts in the track. We have lost many hours at previous shows trying to find a problem. It is time to get smart and find the problem before the show. **Do not test any DCC equipment by powering the track using 12 volts DC.** Reversing units and command stations can be seriously damaged.

The Division portion of the 50-50 raffle is placed in the module fund. This fund is shared with the HO and Ntrak groups as needed for division owned equipment. Privately owned modules and equipment are the responsibility of the owner. All request for funds are to be presented to the Module Chairman.

Let's try to be generous and spend \$5.00 for six 50-50 raffle tickets instead of \$1.00 for one ticket. Your help in funding the Module Group is appreciated.
