Module Report

With the Mt Hope show being canceled, I focused late summer and fall on getting a commitment from Age of Steam to have us come back. I am glad to report that we did go back on December 8, 9,15, and 16. On the 9th with Santa coming they expected to have 500 - 600 people.

Your esteemed Module Chair miscalculated on whether the required modules needed for a show would be

completed. He also goofed in figuring how many modules were needed. He had the number of modules per table correct, but forgot to multiply that times the number of tables he requested.

Some of the modules with track laid did not meet the

specification of 60 mm center to center track spacing. Some adjustment had to be made. Not all of the track was laid on a couple of the corner modules. Jerry Kruse laid some temporary track so that we could run trains. This created some problems as it seemed that on the yellow line when the locomotive got to a turnout, it would short and trip the breaker. The trains would pause till the circuit breaker reset, then would start up again. It was not till the last day that John Spinks traced it to two joints on some of the temporary track that needed tweaking. For the rest of the day we had no shorts. For a couple of hours, Bruce ran the train, at a slow speed, on the red line in reverse trying to match the speed of the train on the yellow line.

I would like to thank all of those who helped. We had enough operators for each day and enough help to set up and tear down.

WHAT WE LEARNED

I am glad that we set up at the Age of Steam. It was a learning experience as to what one needs to set up. Another mistake I made was in not taking more tools along. One thing that needs to be in both RCS (Rolling Command Station) boxes is some wood shims from 1/8 inch to ½ inch. The reason, at least for HO, is that some leveling legs were on the space between the 2 tables, and needed something to bridge the gap. On one of them I had a small level that laid flat was a perfect fit.

As to the RCS, it worked well. On the inside of the lid of the box housing the command station are two papers. The left one is titled: "DIGITRAX LAYOUT STARTUP." It is a step-by-step LIST of instructions on how to power up the RCS.

The second sheet on the lid: "SELECTING AND RUNNING LOCOMOTIVES," is instructions on use of the throttles. How to turn on TRACK PWR and how to acquire a locomotive. I would like to make it a rule that when done operating a locomotive to press the DISP button to clear the command station memory.

I discovered a couple of anomalies that needed to be examined. Were they a result of a wiring mistake or just the way all the components work together?

For the modules, I found one with a wring short and others with the Power Pole (PP) connectors placed in the wrong order. The Power Pole mistake is on me for not

I did not consider the PP order or arrangement till I was making cables and had to figure out how to make them so they would connect.

The WIFI network worked well. I will add the network name to the instruction sheet in the RCS.

Each of the RCS's will have a notebook entitled "RCS MANUAL." Inside are several tabs with

information on each major component of the RCS. The most important Tab is the one labeled "Troubleshooting." I am working on a step-by-step check list of troubleshooting procedures for each major component of the RCS.

WHAT IS NEXT?

All modules will need to pass a T-TRAK MODULE CERTIFICATION FORM to be able to enter an event. This could be done during set up at an event. The Show Coordinator or his team will have the forms available and perform the inspection.

One corner on both the N Scale and HO modules will have one track added for the yellow line and one for the red line. The purpose is to allow a place to make up a train while the layout is in operation. It will also enable one operator to park their train to take a break while someone else operates a different train.

I am hoping that we will be ready for one of the 2024 Spring shows, but not sure that is going to happen. However, we will be ready for shows in the fall of 2024. In December the N Scale layout is committed to Jon Ulbright's Massillon show. The HO layout is tentatively scheduled for the Age of Steam event in December.




